FROM THE CHURCH OF ST MARY THE VIRGIN

Our Services

This report gives the opportunity for the PCC and congregation of St Mary the Virgin, during her well-earned June sabbatical, to say a big thank you to Margaret Clarke. When we enquired as to what needed doing during the month of June, we discovered just how much she does and, more importantly, how much goes "under the radar"! The beneficiaries of her work are not only our church but the Bridges Group as a whole.

On Saturday 23rd May, the church played host to the Priors wedding of the year when Hannah Wallis (Priors Marston) married Callum James (Priors Hardwick). The wedding day was preceded by a feverish week of preparation, with organ tuning, rehearsals and glorious flower arrangements. Externally, mowing and strimming ensured the churchyard was at its best, and even the bridegroom was spotted mowing the grass outside the lychgate so that all would be as perfect as possible on the great day.

Fortunately, all of this, and the wedding day itself, benefited from some unusually hot May weather. One hundred and fifty guests participated in a joyous Marriage Service led by the Rt Revd Dr Edward Condry. Of particular note was the wonderful music, with our organ being complimented by all, not least by the highly accomplished organist, Edward Picton-Turbervill. A celebratory reception was held at the Wallis family home in Priors Marston.

On 7th June, we held our usual Morning Worship, although in this case it was rather different, as Margaret Clarke was not leading us. With the help of our organist, Gerard Hyland, and our regular assistants, the PCC team managed a 40-minute service. The same team looked forward to organising our monthly Communion Service on 21st June, when Revd David Herbert would be presiding.

Our Status

We have now been "in vacancy" - the Church of England term for being without a priest - for over three years. The impact, which is shared throughout the Bridges Group, is a level of exhaustion and frustration as the absent vicar's work is taken up by volunteers. In addition, the advice normally available when dealing with diocesan matters, such as faculties, is missing, which in turn can lead to unnecessary bureaucracy to the disadvantage of the applicant church.

Bishop Sophie's welcome visit to the Group included a Communion Service at St Peter's, Wormleighton, which Margaret Clarke, Christian Nessler, Paul Hobday and I attended

from Priors Hardwick. Her memorable sermon included reference to her joyful experience as a vicar in a rural church in Surrey and her pleasure in interacting with parishioners. This gave me the opportunity, in a short conversation after the service, to plead with her to help us fill our rather-too-long vacancy. We await to see whether any progress can be made.

Report from Your District Councillors – July 2026

Stratford on Avon District Council

South Warwickshire Local Plan

Stratford and Warwick District Councils are working together for a single plan for the region, setting out planning policy for housing, jobs, and infrastructure up to 2050.

The Joint Cabinet Committee of both Councils met on 28 May to discuss whether to make recommendations to each Council in respect of the South Warwickshire Local Plan. It was decided to delay that recommendation for further work to be carried out to the plan. It is now anticipated that the plan will be put before both Councils in July. Should both Councils vote in favour of the plan, then it will proceed to what is known as the Regulation 19 stage. This will be when the plan is published for consultation with the public for a second time, the first being the Preferred Options Public Consultation. Whilst the consultation focusses on the legality and soundness of the plan, if there is any aspect of the plan that residents wish to comment on at this stage, we encourage them to do so. Planning at SDC

Local Enforcement Plan

Planning Enforcement has been one of the things that residents have consistently told us that they would like to see improve at SDC. We have doubled the capacity in the department and at June Cabinet, we approved the draft local enforcement plan. Thank you to all residents and parish councils who took the time to respond to the consultation. The plan will now be used by the Enforcement team and can also be used by residents as a guide to the steps that may be taken with regard to the enforcement of breaches of planning. Five-year Housing Land Supply

Similar to around fifty per cent of local councils, and following the introduction of the new planning rules by the government in December 2024, and the Bordon Hill appeal decision, SDC is working to improve its five year housing land supply. Planning Officers have been through the present local plan to assess which policies still apply in whole, in

part or not at all, until the five-year housing land supply is regained. They have produced a document called the Interim Policy Position Statement (link here: [IPPS Cabinet Report.pdf](#) and [IPPS Appendix 1.pdf](#)) and which residents might find particularly helpful if they are considering commenting on or applying for planning permission.

Community Safety

Unfortunately, the warmer weather seems to have brought some unwanted attention from criminals to the ward with increasing reports of thefts, with Natalie having had one of her chickens stolen from her garden (yes, you did read that right, a pet chicken) and we are aware that the Co-op in Fenny Compton was the target of a particularly unpleasant incident, which is obviously in the hands of the Police.

There are also increased reports of motorcycles speeding, which again, we have made Southam SNT aware of. We are very pleased that residents from Priors Hardwick are in the process of setting up a Community Speed Watch Group and hope that this will discourage speeding in Priors Marston, Hardwick and Wormleighton as drivers become aware of there being active speed monitoring in the area.

As ever, the Police encourage residents to report all incidents, as not only does it help officers investigating build up a picture and possibly connect other incidents that we may not be aware of, it does also help to direct resources. It also helps Natalie, when she is trying to encourage more resource into the ward as Portfolio Holder, which she does on a regular basis. We are aware (as is the Police and Crime Commissioner, as it comes up often at Police and Crime Panel meetings) that 101 remains a rather hit and miss experience at best, and you can report online instead: [Report a crime | Warwickshire Police](#)

If there are additional queries or concerns, then please do let us know and we are happy to raise this directly with the Police when we next meet with them.

Thank you to all residents for their thanks and good wishes since Jake was elected at the start of May. We are working across the ward in the same way as Natalie and Nigel did previously, which we hope will continue to work well for residents. GARDEN JOTTINGS FROM BRIDGE NURSERY

Your local Hardy Plant Specialists

Growing and selling plants is a tricky business to be in. There are trends which I can't keep up with. The weather plays a big part obviously. Basically, I would like a crystal ball to know how busy I might be and which plants will sell. To illustrate this, let me tell you about the second Sunday in June, which turned out to be the busiest sales day since starting here 27 years ago. Most of the purchases were done between 10.30am and 1.30pm. The previous Sunday, the sales were about a tenth of this sum. My ability to be adaptable is challenged. Perhaps having had some rain means that people can get some planting done at the moment. Luckily, I have plenty of plants almost ready for sale plus new cuttings taken, but I'm not sure I could sustain that level of demand.

Some of the intensity of the jobs to be done at this time of year slows down a bit, but most people who are keen can always find something to do. I rarely sit and enjoy it, but I hope you can. Maybe some roses need dead-heading, some vegetables need picking especially peas and beans before they get too large and there are usually some weeds that continue to grow. If you have fruit trees, they will need some pruning and some hedges might need cutting. The hornbeam here is usually trimmed around this time of year. Mowing is relentless, unless we have another dry summer - a repetitive task but the results are pleasing.

Do try to visit open gardens for the National Garden Scheme, such a worthwhile charity. There are many to choose from. Incidentally, I have already sent £800 plus to headquarters and there are still 3 months to go.

WEATHER JOTTINGS MAY 2026

The outstanding feature of the weather during May 2026 was the striking difference between the first three weeks and the last ten days.

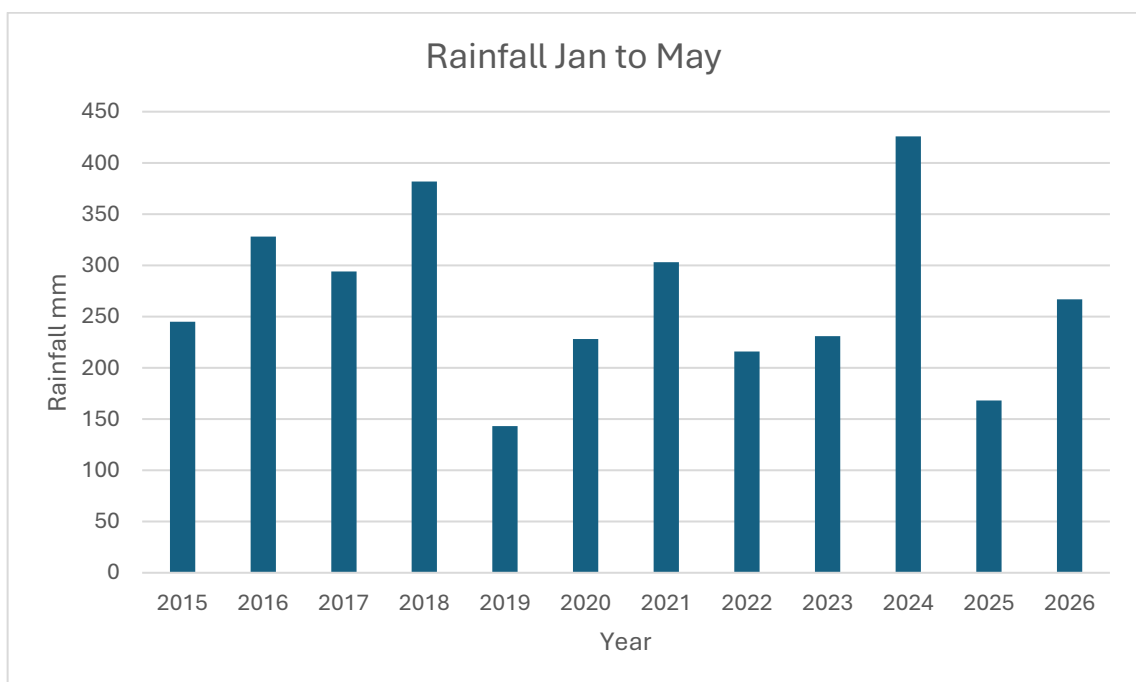
The month had begun with a clear sunny day and a light breeze - 22°C. Then, very gradually, the temperature fell to 12°C on Monday 11th, then gradually recovered to 19°C on Thursday 21st. The first rain of the month came on Saturday 2nd. After a fine start, it clouded over, with light and then heavy rain, resulting in 4mm by the evening. Wednesday 13th brought heavy showers, including some thunder, resulting in 10mm in total; and a thoroughly wet day on Tuesday 19th brought 9mm. The remainder of the rain came as 0.5mm on both Monday 11th and Saturday 16th, together with 2.5mm on Monday 18th.

The majority of the dry sunny days were accompanied by a disappointingly cool breeze from the east... until the change came on Friday 22nd, with 24°C quickly followed by 28°C on the two following days; 30°C on Monday 25th and 31°C on Tuesday 26th. These were the days when the temperatures were setting and breaking one record after another.

It was in fact on the Monday that the highest ever UK temperature of 35.1°C was recorded at Kew Gardens.

A cool strong breeze came as some relief on Wednesday 27th, and then a good thunderstorm during the early hours of Thursday 28th brought 4mm of rain and reduced the heat to 24°C. Saturday 30th was warm again - 28°C, but the month ended with a much more comfortable 23°C.
